Finding Financial Stability and Growing Outreach: The Children's Museum of Science and Technology and the Children's Museum at Saratoga

In September 2021, the Children's Museum of Science and Technology (CMOST) and the Children's Museum at Saratoga (CMAS) signed a management agreement. They will reopen in June of 2022 at a new shared location at the Lincoln Bathhouse in Saratoga Spa State Park. This new space will create a regional children's museum with CMAS managing all aspects of operations, programming, and administration and CMOST expanding their programming. This relocation will feature a larger space with new exhibitions, interactives, classroom space and access to the natural resources and amenities of the State Park.

In November 2021, The Wild Center sent a ten-person delegation to Scotland to attend COP26, the 26th United Nations Climate Change Conference of the Parties. The Museum was one of only two museums in the world to participate as observers in the Blue Zone—the area of COP where the international climate change negotiations take place and only accredited individuals and organizations are permitted within the Blue Zone. Youth climate leaders and delegates participated in the Conference of Youth (COY) — the largest youth conference related to UN climate processes.


MANY Spotlight: Georgette Grier-Key



Dr. Georgette Grier-Key is the inaugural Executive Director and Chief Curator of the Eastville Community Historical Society. Under her leadership at Eastville, membership increased by 30%, funding increased by 52%, and the organization created a strategic plan. Additionally she is the President of the Long Island Historical Societies, serves on the board of the Preservation League of NYS and the NAACP Brookhaven Town Branch and is an adjunct assistant professor at CUNY Medgar Evers College and director of the Long Island History Institute at SUNY Nassau Community College.

She has served on the Museum Association of New York's board of directors since 2017 and will begin her tenure as Vice President in April 2022. We spoke to Dr. Grier-Key to learn about her role in arts and cultural organizations on Long Island's East End.

PARTNERSHIP GRANTS



NYSCA / MANY Partnership Grants for Capacity Building

The Museum Association of New York in partnership with the New York State Council on the Arts will award \$500,000 in capacity building grants to non-profit museums located in New York State. 100 grants of \$5,000 will be awarded.

As this partnership grant program was developed to reach museums not already funded by NYSCA, priority will be given to museums that did not receive NYSCA organizational support funding for FY 2022. Those who received Restart NY and/or Recovery Grants but not organizational support, are considered priority organizations.

Museums with NYSCA organizational support in 2022 may apply, but are not considered priorities.

Grants will be made to:

- Respond to pandemic challenges
- Build financial stability
- Strengthen board engagement
- Grow community engagement
- Update technology
- Change internal systems to address equity, diversity, access, inclusion, and justice

Grant projects cannot begin before June 15, 2022 and must conclude by June 15, 2023.

If a museum is interested in a project that does not fit into the above capacity building categories, please reach out to MANY staff to discuss if the project is the right fit for this funding opportunity.

Grant Application portal opens February 15 and closes on April 1.

New York State Council on the Arts Professional Development Grants

New York State-based museums of any type, or museum service organizations, may apply for support to attend the MANY 2022 Annual Conference for up to \$500.

Application closes February 7 at 5 PM

Humanities NY Action Grants

HNY Action Grants offer up to \$5,000 to implement humanities projects that encourage public audiences to reflect on their values, explore new ideas, and engage with others in their community.

Deadline is February 1 for projects starting May 1 or later. A 1:1 match is required.

Grants for historic structure reports, building condition reports, cultural landscape reports, and cultural resource surveys. This program supports up to 80% of the project cost. Applicants must provide 20% of the total project cost as a cash match. Grants are likely to range between \$5,000 and \$14,000, although we have awarded Preserve New York grants as low as \$2,000 and as high as \$20,000.

Applications are due Friday, April 15.






